Mr. Joe Chang joined DAU in January 2007 as a Professor of Program Management in the DSMC School of Program Management. In March 2007, was assigned as the acting Director of DoD AT&L Workforce and Career Management. He was also responsible for development, maintenance, and implementation of the overarching AT&L Human Capital initiatives. In that capacity, he was also acting as Director, Acquisition Career Management for the 4th Estate Agencies. In May 2008, Mr. Chang returned to DSMC and served in a variety of roles, including; the course manager for the Program Manager's Skills Course from May 2008 to September 2009, the course manager for the Executive Program Manager's Course from September 2009 to July 2012, and currently serving as the course manager for the AT&L Staff Specialist Acquisition Course. Mr. Chang is also serving as a certified DAU Executive Coach.

Prior to joining DAU, Mr Chang served in the U.S. Air Force as a career acquisition and sustainment officer for more than 26 years. His key military assignments include: Program Analyst for Joint Tactical Information Distribution System-JTIDS; Integrated Product Team lead for C-17 Multi-Year Procurement and Performance Based Logistics; Air Staff maintenance staff officer for F-15 and F-16 fighter aircraft; Program Integrator for Theater Missile Defense programs in the Missile Defense Agency; Group commander C2ISR sustainment for U-2, JSTARS, DCGS and classified programs; STRATCOM J81 and System Program Manager for Integrated Strategic Planning and Network-ISPAN program. Mr. Chang retired from the U.S. Air Force at the grade of colonel.

Mr. Chang's formal education includes BS from Cornell University in 1980, MS from Central Michigan University in 1990, and MS from Industrial College of Armed Forces in 2000. He is certified level III in Program Management. Mr Chang is a graduate of DSMC's Program Management Course (PMC 93-1).
