John Mueller joined DAU in July 2010 as a Professor of Program Management in the executive acquisition workforce program. He currently is the Course Manager for the Executive Program Manager's Course and a certified Executive Coach.

Prior to joining DAU, John served a 26 year Air Force career in a variety of acquisition / program management roles. This included positions in program offices, logistics centers, major commands, and on the Air Staff focusing on delivering products to the warfighter.

His assignments included aircraft engine development and testing (Wright-Patterson AFB), space launch (Vandenberg AFB), program support & logistics (Kelly AFB). John also served as an F-22 Program Element Monitor on the Air Staff. He was selected as Commander, DCMA Greenville monitoring contractor compliance and quality for aircraft refurbishments. During this tour, he also served as a deployed Commander, DCMA Southern Iraq with responsibility for LOGCAP task orders on security, housing, and transportation. Following ICAF, John completed a joint duty tour with the Defense Threat Reduction Agency developing systems to counter Weapons of Mass Destruction. His final assignment was the Vice Commander, Space Based Infrared System (SBIRS) Wing with responsibility for the development, deployment, and certification of the newest DoD IR satellite space and ground systems.

John holds a Master of Science degree in National Resource Strategy from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, June 2005 and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Dayton, May 1987. His undergraduate degree is from the University of Notre Dame in Mechanical Engineering. He is Level III certified in program management, acquisition logistics and SPRDE.
